# COLCHESTER TOWN HALL THE MOOT HALL ORGAN



Colchester Town Hall, designed by John Belcher in flamboyant style and opened in 1902, has been described as Colchester's civic cathedral. The organ, with its fine oak case, was designed as the focal point of the elegant Moot Hall (or Assembly Room). It retains its original pneumatic action.

There have been a few subsequent changes. In 1938 the console equipment was augmented; in 1952 the pitch was raised to a = 440 Hz; and in 1973 three stops were replaced by new pipework. These missing stops were reinstated in 2015, when the organ was fully restored.
